

















DBMD (3.5 + 1.5) Program at Temple



DBMD: Dual Bachelor's Master's Degree Program allows students to complete undergraduate study at their home institution (3.5 years) and advanced undergraduate and graduate coursework at Temple (1.5 years).





How does DBMD work?

Students spend three and a half years at their home institution and a year and a half at Temple. At the conclusion of the program, they have a bachelor's degree from the home university and a master's degree from Temple.


Home University's Undergraduate Degree

Is DBMD for you?



- Open to AUAS students entering their 3rd year in good academic standing
- To qualify:
 - TOEFL® Internet-based (iBT) 79 (Minimum)
 - IELTS™ Academic 6.5
 - AUAS GPA main phase average of 6.5
 - GRE >50th percentile score
 - GRE students with AUAS main phase average of 8.0 are WAIVED from GRE requirement





Structure

Fall 4th year at Temple

- 3 Undergraduate Sport and Recreation Management classes
- 2 MS- Sport Business classes
- These 5 classes will count as the ISMB/SM&O minor
- 12 credits will be credited to MS- Sport Business

Spring 4th year




